Half-term heralds empty offices

Half-term usually sees colleagues who are parents take the week off, but employers are not obliged to let them

1. First of all you notice the roads are quiet, then you get to work and find there are clean coffee cups, later you realise your email inbox contains more out-of-office responses than genuine replies What is going on?
2. Half-term has been taking place over the past couple of weeks, and in some workplaces this means as many, if not more, empty work stations than in any week in August. Most of those taking holiday now will be parents, but employers are not obliged to give them time off.
3. Anna Denton, director at law firm Morgan Denton Jones, says that legally no employer is bound to grant an employee any holiday request. "Whether it is granted has to come down to whether it fits with business requirements, so if too many people want to holiday at the same time it has to be reasonable to take it in turns or something has to be done to accommodate the over-demand," she says.
4. "The Working Time Regulations 1998 allow an employer to give a counter-notice to an employee refusing leave, or even to take it at a time that suits the employer." That said, many employers are aware that failing to give parents priority in school holidays might lead to claims, such as sex discrimination, from those with child-care responsibilities – still mainly women – if their holiday request was refused, hence most employers are accommodating."
5. Philip Landau, an employment lawyer at Landau Zeffertt Weir Solicitors, says employers usually allocate breaks on a first-come first-served basis. "If you have an urgent and unexpected requirement to look after your children then you would be entitled to unpaid leave to arrange suitable child care, as you would any other time of the year," he says. "However, the knowledge of a pending half-term would not usually count as an 'unexpected' situation, as you will have had ample notice to arrange child care – unless of course you are let down at the last minute."
6. Landau says parents could also ask for statutory parental leave, which is available to anyone with a child under the age of five. This is unpaid and the maximum you can take at one time is usually a week. However, your employer can postpone this if there is a business case for doing so.
7. In the long summer holidays it can be possible for people to stagger their breaks so everyone gets some time and feels they have been treated fairly, but when there is just a week it can be harder to accommodate everyone. On the flip-side, at this time of year there are probably fewer non-parents who also want to take a break.

The struggle to keep Swaziland's primary schools free

The Swazi government wants top-up fees refunded to parents, but school principals say they can't afford to do that

As the Swazi government struggles to guarantee a no-cost nationwide primary school system, it finds itself sparring with school principals over the question of whether it is a lack of funds or an abundance of corruption that is standing in the way of its success.

Most recently, the government has asked principals of state primary schools to refund an annual top-up fee they have been charging their pupils, without government authority, since the free primary education programme was introduced in 2009.

It is a request that some principals have refused, saying it could bankrupt many schools in this southern African nation. One principal, who asked for anonymity, told IPS that it was not feasible to refund parents because the money had already been used to settle bills with suppliers. It is a view shared by the national principals' association.

"We'll run schools as the government wants us to and – if they collapse because of a lack of funds, it's not our problem," said MduzuziBhembe, president of the Swaziland Principals Association. He added that principals were frustrated by the government's attitude, but he remained noncommittal on when exactly they intend to refund parents.

Schools owe parents an amount estimated to be millions of emalangeni (about 10 emalangeni equals \$1) for the annual top-up fees that most of the country's 558 primary schools charge pupils. While the additional fees vary from school to school, some parents pay up to \$76 per child annually. It is considered a huge sum, as 63% of Swazis live below the poverty line of two dollars a day.

Schools charge these fees in addition to the annual \$62 per child the government pays for pupils in grades one to five. The government's orphan and vulnerable children's grant programme, in addition, pays schools a higher amount of \$220 to \$280 for primary and high school children who have registered for it.

But principals argued that the money paid for the free primary programme does not meet their running costs. According to minister of education and training, Wilson Ntshangase, the money was sufficient to pay for stationery, textbooks, feeding schemes and teachers' salaries. His ministry is determined to get rid of the extra fees, he said, as they make Swazi school dues exceptionally high.

Now, "there are many children who are idling at home even though the government has paid their fees, because they can't afford the top-up fees", Ntshangase said. "[The] government heavily subsidises education, yet the cost of education in this country is escalating," said DumisaniMnisi, Swaziland director for Save the Children. She agreed some schools were operating efficiently with the money that the government paid them.

Regina Masuku's grandchildren attend one of the few primary schools in the country that does not charge top-up fees. "I've got nothing to complain about – except that they eat beans at school every day," Masuku said of the Mnyokane primary school in north-eastern Swaziland.
